


Swap Shop

After over 18 months of being emptied and shut down, the Jaffrey Chamber of Commerce is happy to report that the Swap Shop at the Jaffrey transfer station opened mid-August.

Many people may not know, but the Swap Shop is solely run by volunteers by the Jaffrey Chamber of Commerce. There is no association with the transfer station or the Department of Public Works. It was difficult to staff it before COVID-19 but they knew how valuable it was to the community, so we were determined to make this resource available again.

We made some significant changes to the guidelines as to what they would accept based on the years of history they had as well addressing new concerns and new alternate resources available. They now mainly focus on household wares and tools and small furniture. We decided that, due to both the state of the moisture in the building and the fact that there are other places such as Planet Aid and Salvation Army boxes, as well as other clothing consignment places in town, clothes could go elsewhere without having to be thrown away. Books is another item we have decided not to accept as well, at least for now, as they were inundated with books in the past and ended up throwing them out just the same. While this change has been disappointing to some, most people understand and are still contributing what they would otherwise be throwing into the landfill.

Most importantly to re-open, we had to find volunteers. A few of the trusted and dedicated volunteers from before the closure came back: Susan

Leach, Carolyn Jalbert and Joanne Buck. Some new community members are coming on board: Judy Mortner, Dianne Cook, Sarah Wright and Casey Leach. These volunteers work sorting items, shelving them and then watching them go back out the door to new homes - exactly as intended. The staff at the transfer station have welcomed the re-opening as well. They report they get multiple questions about it and are happy to be able to tell residents that it is open again on Saturdays and, thanks to Judy Mortner, Wednesday mornings, as well.

Signs are now posted with hours and guidelines of what is accepted and not accepted.

We believe this resource is not only a great way to help protect the environment by saving many things from going into the Jaffrey landfill, but it is also a great place to meet with fellow residents and share treasures that would otherwise just be discarded.

The Swap Shop will be closed for the winter but will re-open in March. We are also thrilled to report that the viable goods that remain at the Swap Shop prior to closing for the season will be donated to the Afghan refugee families that are being relocated to New Hampshire. One more way the Swap Shop and the Jaffrey Chamber are giving back to the community—even beyond Jaffrey.
