#### Alice Poole Trust Provides **Grants and Loans to Locals**

Alice W. Poole executed her Last Will and Testament on July 22, 1939. The Will states that: "All the rest, residue and remainder of my property and estate of every kind and wherever situated, I give, bequeath and devise to the Town of Jaffrey, as trustee, in trust, to hold, manage and invest," with the intent that the fund be used for the wellbeing of the elderly and youth.

Today, the Alice Poole Fund is registered with the State of New Hampshire Secretary of State and provides grants and loans to Jaffrey residents for activities not provided by other services or tax dollars with an emphasis on the elderly and youth. The Alice Poole Fund is managed by the Jaffrey Trustees of Trust Funds.

The Alice Poole Fund also provides no-interest loans to students from Jaffrey who are furthering their education. Prior to an application, the student must have completed one semester of higher education. Loan amounts are based upon available funds, and the award can be up to \$1,000 per application request per semester. An application must be requested for each semester, and applications are accepted anytime. This is an interestfree loan with repayment and payment plans with a minimum of \$25.00 a month available. Payment commences one year after graduation or immediately following cessation of formal education prior to graduation.

Bach Sonata Nos. 1 and 3 (BWV 1001 and BWV 1005) complete an extraordinary evening of violin artistry. David McCarroll has been described as "a violinist of mature musicality and deep understanding of his repertoire whose playing is distinguished by clarity of form and line" by Musik Heute.

Winner of the 2012 European Young Concert Artists Auditions and Silver Medalist at the Klein International Competition, he made his concerto debut with the London Mozart Players in 2002 and has since appeared with orchestras including Radio
